We are pleased to feature at our upcoming program, West Pittston native, author Juanita Patience Moss whose family is part of the rich history of our community.

Juanita Patience Moss is a product of the West Pittston Public School system. She attended Bennett College, Greensboro, N.C.; received a BS degree from Wilkes University, and a MA degree from Fairleigh Dickinson University, Rutherford, New Jersey.

Her interest in genealogy and writing did not develop until her retirement after



thirty-three years of teaching high school biology at Bloomfield High School,

Bloomfield, New Jersey. After moving to Virginia, easy access to the Library of Congress and the National Archives in Washington, D.C., made her research possible.

Ms. Moss recently published her fourth book, *Anthracite Coal Art by Charles Edgar Patience*. It discusses the unique work of her father from the 30s to the early 70s when he died.
